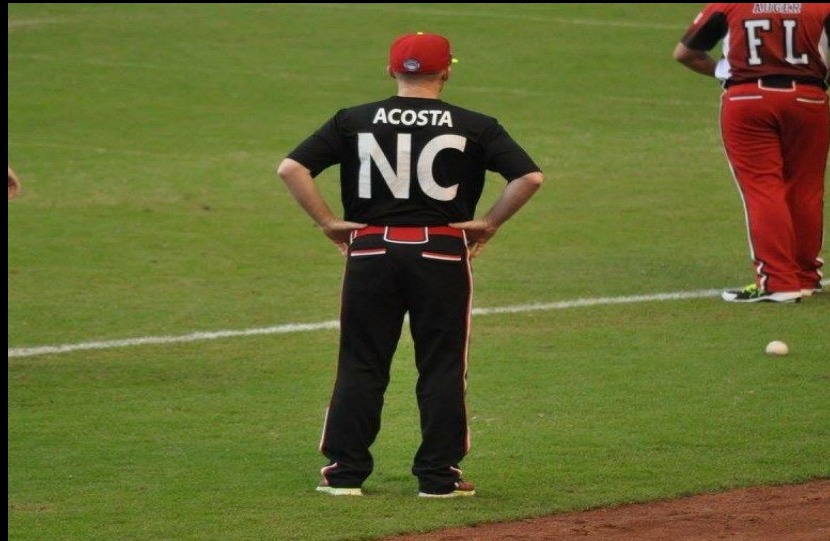


Trauma Led Leadership

Is everyone valued?

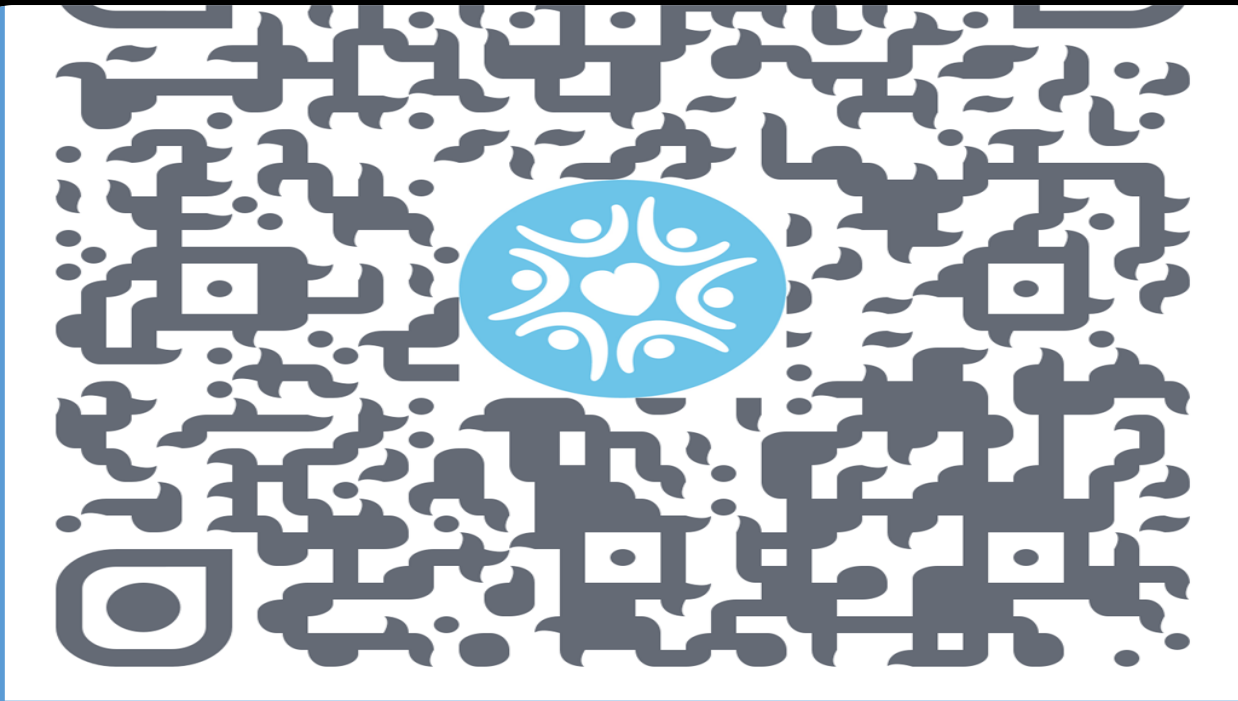
