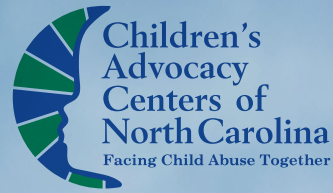

The 4th Annual "Taking Child Abuse  
Interventions to New Heights" symposium

Geared for professionals involved within a  
**Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)** as part of the  
children's advocacy center (CAC) model,  
this training allows for discipline-specific  
and/or cross-training of professionals in  
the investigation, evaluation, treatment and  
prosecution of child maltreatment cases.

1. Recognize and describe the ways in which  
professionals dealing with child abuse  
(from their various disciplines) collaborate  
to make the investigation, evaluation and  
prosecution of child maltreatment cases  
stronger and more efficient.
2. Apply knowledge and skills to improve  
the multi-disciplinary response of  
professionals dealing with child abuse in  
the investigation, evaluation, treatment and  
prosecution of child maltreatment cases.

## Featured Speakers



### **Keynote Speaker: Olga Trujillo, JD**

Olga is the Director of Education & Social Change at Latinos United for Peace and Equity (LUPE), a National Initiative of Caminar Latino. Olga has served as a private attorney, for the U.S. DOJ and as a consultant to local, state and national organizations. Her focus has been working with law enforcement, prosecutors and courts to enhance their response to domestic violence, child abuse, sexual assault, trafficking victims and immigrant communities. Olga is an international speaker and author and is featured in the video "A Survivor's Story", a documentary based on her personal experience of violence. Her memoir entitled *The Sum of My Parts* was released in October 2011. In 2012, she also co-authored a Handbook for Attorneys *Representing Domestic Violence Survivors Who Are Also Experiencing Trauma and Mental Health Challenges*.



### **Geraldine Crisci, MSW**

Geraldine is a mental health professional and a private practitioner who provides assessment and treatment to children, youth and families. She provides educational programs to mental health, protective services, law enforcement, medical and other helping professions. She developed and teaches a six-day Trauma Assessment and Treatment Program which has reached over 6,000 professionals. She has developed protocols for the assessment and treatment of trauma, sexualized behavior problems in prepubescent children and sibling sexual abuse. Geraldine specializes in addressing the impact of trauma on the behavior of children and youth. She is a member of the APSAC, ATSA and a member of the College of Registered Psychotherapists of Ontario (CPRO) and the Ontario Association of Social Workers (OASW). She co-authored *Paper Dolls and Paper Airplanes: Therapeutic Exercises for Sexually Traumatized Children*.



### **Carrie Paschall, BA**

Carrie Paschall is the Chief Investigative and Support Services Officer for the Dallas CAC and has conducted over 5,502 child forensic interviews. Carrie is an expert witness in forensic interviews of children and has testified in juvenile and district courts in Texas, Georgia, and Louisiana. Prior to working for the DA's office, Carrie was an investigator for CPS. Carrie speaks to other professionals about how interviews of children are conducted in child abuse investigations, as well as about topics such as grooming, recantation, and disclosure dynamics. She has a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science with an emphasis in public law and a minor in criminal justice from the University of Texas in Arlington.

## Featured Speakers



### **Darrel Turner, PhD**

Dr. Turner received his PhD in Clinical Psychology from Sam Houston State University. He has published research articles on risk assessment of sex offenders, risk assessment tools, child sex offender and victim behaviors, risk assessment of child pornography offenders, and juror perceptions and decision making in sex offense cases. He worked at the US Penitentiary at Pollock, LA as a staff psychologist. Currently, Dr. Turner is in private practice and works nationwide as an expert witness for attorneys and as a consultant with various law enforcement agencies. Darrel teaches at two University Psychology Departments about Ethical Principles in Forensic Evaluations, General Ethical Principles in Psychology, Psychological/Criminal Profiling, and Statistical Methods in Psychological Research.



### **Victor Vieth, JD**

Victor has trained numerous professionals pertaining to child abuse investigations, prosecutions and prevention. He gained national recognition for his work as a prosecutor in rural Minnesota. He is the Director of Education and Research of the Zero Abuse Project. Victor has been instrumental in implementing forensic interview training programs in undergraduate and graduate programs on child maltreatment. He graduated from WSU and earned his Juris Doctor from Hamline University School of Law. In 2017, Victor earned an MA in theology from Wartburg Seminary. He is author of *Unto the Third Generation*, a bold initiative that outlines the necessary steps to eliminate child abuse in America in three generations, and *On This Rock: A Call to Center the Christian Response to Child Abuse on the Life and Works of Jesus*.



### **Mike Weber, BS**

Detective Weber has 35 years law enforcement experience, including 12 years as a crimes against children investigator. In 2016, Mike was awarded the NCMEC Texas Hero for Children Award for the investigation of Geronimo Aguilar. Detective Weber co-authored the APSAC best practice guidelines on Medical Child Abuse titled "Munchausen by Proxy: Clinical and Case Management." He also authored a separate article in the same issue of the Advisor titled "Investigation of Factitious Disorder Imposed on Another and Medical Child Abuse" and authored "Investigating Medical Child Abuse" for the FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin journal. Mike is currently assigned to investigate crimes against children for the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office and handles all reports of medical child abuse in Tarrant County, TX.
