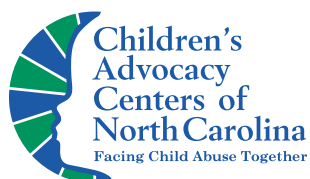

law enforcement officers, DSS/CPS workers, prosecutors,
medical professionals, mental health professionals (including
psychologists & social workers), GAL advocates, case managers,
juvenile justice workers, child advocacy professionals and
victim service providers serving child victims.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The 27th Annual "Reflections" Symposium on Child Abuse
& Neglect offers a multi-disciplinary training opportunity
for professionals dealing with child abuse. Geared for
professionals involved within a **Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)**
as part of the children's advocacy center (CAC) model, this
training allows for discipline-specific and/or cross-training of
professionals in the investigation, evaluation, treatment and
prosecution of child maltreatment cases.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this educational activity, the participant
should be able to:

1. Recognize and describe the ways in which professionals dealing
with child abuse (from their various disciplines) collaborate
to make the investigation, evaluation and prosecution of child
maltreatment cases stronger and more efficient.
2. Apply knowledge and skills to improve the multi-disciplinary
response of professionals dealing with child abuse in the
investigation, evaluation, treatment and prosecution of child
maltreatment cases.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

KENDALL WOLZ, MA

Kendall Wolz is the Center Director of Baptist Friendship House in New Orleans. She graduated from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary in May 2018 with a MA Counseling specialization in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. She is the author of "Brave Girl, Speak," a blog dedicated to educating readers about childhood sexual abuse and its impacts on victims, the sex offender registries and how to navigate the legal system, and a personal look at the healing journey from trauma. She is a member of American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children, American Association of Christian Counselors, and New Orleans FBI Citizens Academy Alumni Association.



NICK ZADINA, MA

Nick Zadina is the Director of Training at Project Harmony in Omaha, NE and has been training professionals in child welfare for the past twelve years. Nick has experience as a crisis counselor at the Boys Town National Hotline and served as the Artistic Director of the education theatre nonprofit Respect. Nick has an MA in Theatre from the University of Nebraska at Omaha. He has trained across the country including at the San Diego International Conference on Child and Family Maltreatment, the National Symposium of Child Abuse, and at the Bullying Research Network conference.



JERRI SITES, MA

Jerri has over 28 years of experience working in the field of child abuse investigations. She has conducted over 2,100 child forensic interviews, testified on countless occasions as an expert witness. Jerri has vast experience in providing trauma-informed, research-based training and technical assistance to MDTs, CACs, and child serving professionals. Jerri co-authored "The Child Abuse Investigative Field Guide," co-authored "Research to Practice" white papers, and co-authored the publication, "Listen and Learn: A Process for Initiating Collaboration between Tribal Communities and CACs."



JIMMY WIDDIFIELD, JR., MA, LPC

Jimmy Widdifield, Jr. is the Freestanding Multidisciplinary Teams (FSMDT) Programs Manager at the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth and is responsible for supporting and monitoring more than 35 FSMDT in Oklahoma according to statute and administrative code and coordinating and providing training and technical assistance on multi- and interdisciplinary issues in child maltreatment to MDT members and other professionals. He worked as the Training Director for the University of Oklahoma Problematic Sexual Behavior Training/Technical Assistance Program and the National Center on the Sexual Behavior of Youth. Mr. Widdifield is a LPC who is trained in several evidence-based treatments that address the impact of child maltreatment and trauma.



MARY-ANN BURKHART, JD

Mary-Ann is Chief of the Special Victims' Unit for the Anne Arundel County State's Attorney's Office in Maryland. She returned to the State's Attorney's Office from the Association of Prosecuting Attorney's in Washington, DC, where she served as the Director of the Child Abuse Prosecution Project. She was the Director of the National Center for Prosecution of Child Abuse at the National District Attorney's Association. She authored *Maryland's Response to Human Trafficking: A New Statute for New Times*, which was published in the Maryland Bar Journal. She graduated from Barry University and received her JD degree from the University of Miami School of Law. For her work and commitment in the area of child abuse, she received the 2011 Professional Achievement and Distinguished Alumnus Award from Barry University.



KEVIN MCNEIL, M.DIV

Kevin McNeil is a motivational speaker, victim advocate, author, and the CEO of the Twe12e Project, an organization that educates the world on the effects of abuse. Kevin retired from the DeKalb County Police Department serving as a Police Officer and Special Victims Unit Detective. Kevin's background coupled with his extensive research on trauma and the effects of abuse both defines and differentiates his message. Kevin obtained his Master of Divinity Degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia.
